Acute infectious cough

For consideration of antibiotic therapy for moderate cough with a moderate likelihood of bacterial cause.


What causes an acute cough?

It can be caused by viruses (\ge 90%) or less often by bacteria (< 10%) and starts from an upper respiratory tract infection (common cold).


How long does an acute cough last?

The symptoms of an acute cough usually resolve within **4 weeks** (average duration is 18 days).


100 affected persons who **don't** take antibiotics



With antibiotics, **4 more** people out of 100 will have **reduced cough** after **7 days** 100 affected persons who **do** take antibiotics




100 affected persons who **don't** take antibiotics




With antibiotics, 6 more people out of 100 will have reduced cough

Side effects from antibiotics

With antibiotics, **14 more** people out of 100 will have symptoms like vomiting, diarrhea and/or skin rash. 100 affected persons who **do** take antibiotics
